


Prospective New Alpine Rover:

Maintenance Plans

When the snow melts and the road is open we will endeavour to continue with the cladding, installing UV water disinfection, many painting tasks including the kitchen, scraping and recoating the bathroom floor, replacing chimney pots, annual cleaning tasks, and any repairs necessary after winter.

To complete the cladding on the south side walls, we require more scaffolding or at least 3 meters high. If anyone is able to loan us scaffolding it would be greatly appreciated, contact bogongchalet@vicscouts.asn.au if you can assist us. We can always put together small projects for Rover crews to do if they attend on a week end by themselves.

Renovation Plans

Besides continuing with the exterior cladding and wall insulation works, no new major works projects are planned by the BCMG.

The regular week 5 attendees will be replacing the balcony at the east of the chalet as a separate project.

We are also looking at going greener. Government grants are available for renewable energy in remote locations so we are currently investigating solar, wind and hydro options for power generation. We are also looking at a new slow combustion heater for the dinning room to reduce our carbon footprint. Due to the size of this job and the amount of planning involved we see this to be done in summer 2008/9
